The term *review* is interpreted broadly to include a wide range of papers that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- tutorials on important topics;
- expository papers on emerging areas of research or application;
- papers describing new developments and/or challenges in relevant areas;
- white papers on topics of importance to the profession or society;
- historical assessment of seminal papers in the field and their impact; and
- articles on history of statistics and probability
- interviews with statisticians who have made prominent contributions to research and applications and to the development of the profession

IS Review is the flagship journal of the International Statistical Institute and its family of seven Associations. These include: Bernoulli Society, International Association for Official Statistics, International Association for Statistical Computing, International Association for Statistics Education, International Association of Survey Statistics, International Society for Business and Industrial Statistics, and The International Environmetrics Society. The journal is published by Wiley-Blackwell for the ISI.
