Papers Confirmed for IASE Satellite Conference

The IASE Satellite in Kuala Lumpur will begin on 14 August, with optional workshops on 13 August, about a month from now. The conference will be hosted by statistics educators from Universiti Teknologi MARA and Universiti Putra Malaysia and supported by the Bank Negara Malaysia (BNM of Malaysia).

Three keynote sessions have been announced:

“Data Science for all. Sure, but who, where, what, how and why?”

– Richard de Veaux from Williams College;

“Malaysia: Wind Energy Distribution Recent Development”

– Azami Zaharim, National University of Malaysia;

“Data Literacy Should Not be Optional: Implications for Statistics Educators and for IASE”

– Gail Burrill, Michigan State University.
