### **General Assembly at the ISI World Statistics Congress**

The annual IASE General Assembly will be held during the ISI World Statistics Congress at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre. The assembly will take place in room MR405 at 12:40 on 22 August 2019. One topic will be potential changes in the IASE Statutes. Particular changes include renaming Vice President positions and removing the special roles of Vice President for Finance and Scientific Programmes, and allowing electronic votes for Executive Committee members. IASE members and interested parties are encouraged to attend.

### **Submissions Open for ICME-14**

The International Congress on Mathematical Education (ICME), held every four years, will have its 14th meeting from 12 July 2020 to 19 July 2020 at the Shanghai Convention and Exhibition Center of International Sourcing in Putuo District, Shanghai, China. Most presentations are about teaching mathematics, but two Topic Study Groups are devoted to topics related to the IASE. Topic Study Group 11, Teaching and learning of probability, will be chaired by Egan Chernoff ([egen.chernoff@usask.ca](mailto:egen.chernoff@usask.ca)); Topic Study Group 12, Teaching and learning of statistics, will be chaired by Enriqueta Reston ([edreston@usc.edu.ph](mailto:edreston@usc.edu.ph)).

Each participant can submit one paper or poster to one Topic Study Group and be a secondary author on up to two other contributions. All submissions will be peer reviewed. Paper submissions can range up to 4 pages; posters require a one-page outline. The conference website [icme14.org](http://icme14.org) has paper and poster templates for use. Paper submissions are due on 15 September. Poster submissions have two possible deadlines, the first on 15 September and the second on 29 February. The conference website has a longer announcement; further questions can be directed to the topic study group chairs.
